St. Patrick's Day Activities

Downtown St. Louis Parade

The streets of downtown St. Louis will become a sea of green as thousands of visitors attend the annual St. Patrick's Day Parade. This family-friendly event features more than 120 marching bands, floats and giant balloons. The parade begins at 1 p.m., at 20th and Market Streets and makes its way east, ending at Broadway and Clark. Before or after the parade, stop by the Irish Village at Ballpark Village for food, shopping and live music.

The Hibernian Parade

Every year on St. Patrick's Day, crowds flock to the Dogtown neighborhood for the Ancient Order of Hibernians Parade. You won't see giant balloons or floats in this parade, but there are plenty of local Irish families who proudly march to honor their homeland. After the parade, the crowds stick around for a big street party, although it may be less rowdy than in years past. The parade begins at 10am and starts at Tamm & Oakland and ends at Tamm & Manchester.

Easter Sunday April 21, 2019

Since 1961 the Concours d'Elegance car show has taken place in Forest Park, in the upper Muni lot, the cars start to arrive at sunrise. Wear your walking shoes or your flapper dress or poodle skirt, and meander around the classics of yesterday. Averaging around 500 cars to see, there will sure be your favorites in the lot.
