The Name's Danger. Sherri Danger

Her plan was to major in Journalism, but her practicality and her desire for food, clothing and shelter led her to change her major to more lucrative Mechanical Engineering. Upon receiving her degree, she came to St. Louis for work and in time joined Chrysler. It was at Chrysler that Sherri met her devoted husband, Bob (Bobo). They were married in 1991. Sherri says that it was Bob who changed her from practical and cautious to a risk taker and adventurer.

In the early 90s as a couple, they wrote for "Intermission", an Arts & Entertainment magazine: "15 Minutes", an Arts broadsheet; StL Today;



and volunteered as hosts of the "Bob and Sherri Show" on KDHX which ran in the wee hours of the morning from 1-3 AM. The old "Bob and Sherri Show" led to Sherri currently hosting her own KDHX show every Friday afternoon from 2-4 PM. Her focus is on Women in Music. When Bob retired from Chrysler in June 1994, they made the decision that they wanted to share experiences together as a couple and so Sherri also left Chrysler. Three months later they opened the "Way Out" bar on Cherokee. Six years later they moved the "Way Out" to Jefferson Avenue. The "Way Out" hosted and encouraged numerous local bands, poets, and artists giving many of them their local debut.

Sherri says that she has always been active and physically strong - gymnastics, track and cheerleading in high school. As an adult - African dance, belly dancing, Zumba, Zumba Gold, step, tai chi, yoga, chair yoga, and personal trainer. It was as a student that she realized she has what it takes to be the teacher and so pursued certification.

Reduce the Risk of Common Infections

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), there is an increase in infectious diseases and a growing resistance to antibiotics. Every year, about 2 million people get sick from a superbug. About 23,000 die. A superbug is a term to describe bacteria that cannot be killed using multiple antibiotics. Misusing antibiotics (such as taking them when you don't need them or not finishing all of your medicine) is the "single leading factor" contributing to this problem according to the CDC.

Therefore, effective cleaning techniques and basic health practices such as frequent hand washing are especially important. Hand washing is the single most effective way to prevent spreading germs.

Clean Hands Are Healthy Hands

Our bodies naturally carry germs on them. Most of these germs are harmless, and some are even essential to our health! However, germs from other sources, such as raw meat, can also survive on hands, and these can be easily transferred to other surfaces, increasing the risk of cross-contamination. Because our hands are in frequent contact with our eyes, nose, and mouth, it's easy to see how dirty hands spread germs and illnesses, everything from the common cold, to the flu, to food poisoning.

To minimize the chance of infection always wash your hands:

- before and after contact with other people
- when returning from a trip outside the house
- after using the toilet
- after sneezing or blowing your nose
- before preparing medications, doing a procedure or preparing food

When cleaning, work from the cleanest to the dirtiest area and always wear latex gloves when giving personal care.

Hand Washing— Do It Right!

It's the single most important way to prevent the spread of infectious diseases.

- Rub your hands for at least 30 seconds (about the time it takes to sing Happy Birthday slowly) to produce lots of lather. Lather-up away from running water so the lather is not washed away.
- 2. Use a nailbrush on your nails; keep your nails trimmed and free of chips.
- 3. Wash front and back of hands, between fingers and at least two inches up your wrists.
- 4. Rinse well under warm running water. Repeat the process.
- 5. Dry your hands on a clean cloth or paper towel.

Hand sanitizer gels can be used to kill germs, but they should not replace hand washing.

Hand sanitizers can build up on skin, so wash your hands the regular way—with soap and warm water—after every fourth use.
